

TODAY AT THE DOD

A few headaches still with possible duplications but most of the semi final and finals are now updated on the website except a few different scenarios regarding triples, U25 singles and U25 pairs.

O60 pairs this morning with first result in being Rob Hughes and Rhys Cleaver of Briton Ferry Steel winning 24-3 against Meirion Jones and Gwyn Jones of Aberaeron. John Langley and Adrian Freeman, Blaenavon, beat Jeff Wright and Brian Griffiths, Barry Romilly, 22-11. Gareth Jones and Martin Johnson, Llansawell, beat Stuart Evans and Gareth Hughes, Harlequins, 15-12. The last first round match saw Kidwelly Town beat Penygraig 17-11.

In the triples, Whitchurch beat Graig Merthyr 22-5, RTB beat Presteigne 23-8, Briton Ferry Steel beat Aberystwyth 19-8, Thomastown beat Brynhyfryd 19-11, Ely Valley scored a five on the last end to pip Llanbradach 17-16, Berriew beat Resolven 18-14, Tenby beat Blaenrhondda 16-12 and Crosskeys beat Dinas Powys 19-12.

In the Ladies fours Ynysddu beat Llandrindod Wells 21-7 and Lampeter beat Builth wells 22-21 after an extra end to set up a Ynysddu v Lampeter final.

In the mixed singles event Mark Wheadon of Whitchurch has booked a place in the semi-final after beating Paul Evans, Sketty, 21-6. He will now face Craig Maycock who beat Chris Spriggs 21-13. They are joined by the only lady left in the competition Caroline Taylor who beat Graeme Howard 21-12.

In the O60 singles semi final Anthony Pritchard has beaten Martin Selway 21-7, in the final he will meet Paul Browning who beat John Vesey 21-15.

The delayed mixed singles quarter final saw Martin Selway beat Sam Roff 21-9, the semi final in this half of the draw will now take place on Friday at 09:30 with the final following at 12:30. Martin will play Caroline Taylor.

O60 pairs continued with Rob Hughes and Rhys Cleaver of Briton Ferry Steel beating John Langley and Adrian Freeman of Blaenavon 17-16. They will now play RA Evans and D Rowlands of Machynlleth in the semi final on Friday. The other match saw Llansawel beat Kidwelly Town 21-19 and they will now play Brecon in the semi final.

Back to the triples and the first semifinalists are RTB Ebbw Vale who beat Berriew 21-8, they are joined in the semifinal by Crosskeys who beat Briton Ferry Steel in a nail biter 14-13. They are joined by Ely Valley who beat Whitchurch in another thriller 17-16, The last place in the semi final was claimed by Tenby who won another last end thriller 15-14 against a young Thomastown trio.

Another final to conclude the day saw the Lampeter ladies four take the gold medal and Ynysddu the silver medal in the ladies fours competition. Congratulations to Lampeter, Eileen Lloyd, Maria Thomas, Anwen Butten MBE and Alis Butten who beat Ynysddu, Terrine Lane, Linda Warwick, Jackie Jones and Heather Collins 27-10.
